	 1. Update on COVID-19 Survey dissemination: • We have started building report from survey results, 75% along the way.
	 Themes of report include financial impacts, academic impacts, research impacts, personal/home impacts, and student/caucus recommendation.
	 Report will be presented to PPAC next week by Manvir on the 22nd. Report will be shared with all student/faculty body (stay tuned for date).
	 Career Fair Event: Scheduled to occur in November (stay tuned for official date announcement):

- The grad caucus deemed it necessary to host a career fair event (on zoom) due to the highly competitive nature of public health and the concerns raised by many 2nd-years about landing a job immediately after graduation.
 Also, some 1st-years are at the climax of deciding the field of public health/organization (that aligns with their career goals and aspirations) to have their practicums.
- A survey will be sent out within the next week for students' preferred public health organization, interests and availability. The grad caucus intends to contact SFU alumni in these organizations to be facilitators at the event.
- 3. Debrief for August anti-racism dialogue: Scheduled for October 23rd, 2020
- Debrief will be held on the 23rd
 with a variety of Faculty
 members, and current caucus
- We will present the main findings with some members of

the previous caucus who planned this event

- We will present the main themes, next steps
- 4. Update on student anti-racism working group:
- We don't know if we will keep this because the Faculty wants to integrate anti-racism within all structures and organizations of FHS
- This means that we are hoping we will be able to work as student body, WITH the faculty
- We will have more updates at tomorrow's FC meeting
- 5. Follow up on Peer mentorship Program - Mentor-Mentee Zoom Hangout:
- The program took place on the 8th of October and we had an impressive turnout with about 26 students (mentors and mentees) in attendance. It was a great avenue for secondyears to meet with first-years. We had 2 mentors discuss tips

on navigating 1st year of graduate school, we also had the MSC/PHD representative (Amanda Rowlands) share advice for MSc and PHD students. Mentors/Mentees were assigned to breakout rooms where mentors interacted with mentees and addressed questions and concerns from Mentees.

Some of the suggestions/recommendations offered include: Enrolling in Volunteer positions with NGOs; Collaboration with fellow colleagues, 2nd-years and Faculty; build connections and social interaction; prompt commencement of the Epidemiology final paper; get engaged and be involved. To add, be aware that there is an opportunity to transition directly into the PHD program and explore Research commons **SFU** page (https://www.lib.sfu.ca/a bout/branches-depts/rc) for free courses like statistical programming languages, scientific/article writing, referencing and other

workshops for graduate students.

 Generally, it was a fruitful and rewarding event.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- 1. FEC meeting
- We heard about a few ideas from the anti-racism working group within Faculty on addressing this issue within the Faculty (eg: workshop, looking at student representation deployed within Faculty level committees, reviewing policies and processes, reviewing hiring/search processes etc.)
- Also highlighted a collaborative effort between MPH professors and 1st year MPH students to create a safer space to discuss heavy topics presented in classes like HSCI900 and HSCI835
- We are waiting for UBC to make a decision about the WDA
- Discussion about option to offer virtual version of classes

in parallel to in-person going forward

- Kellie (FHS Program Manager)
 is back in her previous position;
 Robyn has left as she was a
 temporary hire.
- A request has been put forth for a partial in-person format for the MPH Capstone

2. FC meeting

- Will happen Thursday Oct 15th, in the afternoon
- Faculty will bring discussion about anti-racism efforts to this meeting, in an effort to embed anti-racism within the entire Faculty

3. PPAC Meeting

Mentorship for MPH students
 Malcolm asked for suggestions
 to allow new students to
 connect with faculty, such as
 brown bag sessions. It was
 suggested that meetings focus
 around specific topics such as
 the practicum. Malcolm asked
 Manvir to canvas students for
 topics they would like to meet
 about and associated faculty to

invite. Malcolm also asked for feedback regarding inclusion of adjunct professors in the mentorship of MPH students. The committee agreed that it would be best to contact adjuncts directly to request their participation in brown bag sessions or other options for involvement.

WDA Implications

Robyn reminded the committee that students will be limited to one directed reading and/or one WDA. Forms on the website will be updated to reflect this limit and the program manager will inform/remind students during the semester dates and deadlines. Additional options could include courses at SFU but outside of the faculty. At the moment, UBC is still listed as part of the WDA on the website, however, indications have been made that UBC may not be accepting further WDA requests starting in the fall semester.

• Graduate Student Report

The Fall 2020 cohort has connected several times over the summer through Whatsapp and Facebook. There was a question regarding payment of the entrance scholarship and if

students who are paying tuition installments would be able to use the scholarship for the fall semester. Robyn explained that the scholarship will be deposited into the students' accounts in the third week of the semester and all outstanding tuition will be deducted. Any remainder may be left in the student account or direct deposited. Regarding use of the scholarship for installments, Robyn will confirm with GPS.

Online asynchronous versus synchronous teaching. Students were seeking clarity regarding delivery of online courses and expectations. Malcolm explained that first term instructors were invited to the orientation to discuss how their respective courses would be delivered online. Faculty consensus is that the course would be synchronous at the time listed on the schedule, however, asynchronous teaching may be necessary. Additionally, synchronous teaching would be recorded. Office hours would also be an option for students to connect synchronously with the instructor. A clear policy for online teaching would be helpful for the students,

therefore, Malcolm will draft a message in consultation with Nicole Berry to be sent to all MPH students and instructors.

4. GSS Meeting

- SFU Licensing Agreement approved for 3 years
- Estimated cost \$22k for this year until August 2021
- Rent after this will be \$25373k
 for 2021-2022 fiscal year
- Voted in favour of signing licensing agreement
- Strategy to occupy space now so that GSS is positioned for long term negotiations
- SFU Sustainability Initiatives
- SFU 2025 advisory council

- Living lab research funding (students can submit proposals)

- Bringing InProgress back is a great opportunity for students

to practice presenting their work in front of a supportive.

4. Faculty response to Open Letter addressing anti-racism in FHS

- We just found out that there was an official response to the Open Letter on anti-racism within the Faculty that was written by some Faculty members, as not all of them have seen the letter due to some conflicts[TM1]
- We will forward this response to the entire FHS student body

5. First year MPH cohort academic concerns

- Biostatistics Course
- Student concern surrounding delivery of the lecture and method of instruction
- Students gave some feedback to prof which has been improved upon but students still seem to be struggling with the method of delivery (ie PowerPoint presentation would likely be helpful)
- Suggestion is to discuss course delivery with professor directly first before bringing this to a committee meeting

- Requirements outside of HSCI 900 course time
- Saturday workshop (people have children, part time jobs, health care appointments that had to be re-scheduled)
- Improve coordination between course deadlines and re-visit requiring outside of class requirements on weekends
- Bring to committee meeting

6. Community Action Fund

- You can find more info in the newly ratified constitution, can be found on the caucus website
- \$700 yearly budget provided by Faculty
- Each project can be eligible for a maximum of \$200 per event or \$150 for a recurring event.
- We will provide more information about the application process as soon as possible; in the meantime, if any student is interested, they can go through the details in the constitution and submit their request/proposal by email to caucus members.

7. International Student Concerns

- Need for more faculty support.
- Want professors to be more understanding about work. constraints and less tedious readings
- Regular check-ins/ reaching out to students in difficult time zones.
- Need for cohesive policy for synchronous/asynchronous and attendance.
