- 3. Events/Social Coordinator update
  - Happy hour chat: next Thursday with a raffle to boost participation (maybe bookstore giftcard)
  - Reached out to HSUSU to connect about possible connections between undergrads and grads, but no reply as of yet
- 4. MSc/PhD Update
  - MSc/PhD career night: March 18, have to send out an invite with poster, are currently recruiting speakers through the MSc/PhD program head (former grads, reach out to Health Canada, reach out to Malcolm), got permission for a small honorarium for speakers
  - -Note from Angela Kaida: Women's health institute has their annual research symposium next Thursday, will include in next week's newsletter
  - -FHS Research conference day: proposal from Bob Hogg, basically it's a conference for all FHS students (undergrad and grad), a place to present research and connect undergrads, grads, and faculty. One of the research coordinators has proposed a couple of half days and it is currently being reviewed

Starting on the first day of March there is an admissions meeting and they go over the applicants that didn't have consensus from the reviewers. Recommendations go out March 15: this where offers of acceptance go out
